

英 语

一、培养目标

本专业旨在培养具有扎实的英语语言基础，比较系统的英语语言文学专业知识和一定的其他相关专业知识，较高的人文素养，具有熟练的英语语言综合运用能力和跨文化交际能力，能够胜任有关单位的教学、科研、外事、新闻出版、经贸、管理、旅游等工作的专门人才。

二、基本规格要求

- 1. 具备扎实的英语语言基础知识和较强的英语语言理解和使用能力；具备英汉两种语言的对比能力，并较好地了解中西方在文化、文学、哲学、宗教方面的差异；
- 2. 比较系统地掌握语言学、文学专业知识，较好地了解主要英语国家社会、历史及文化，具备较高的人文素养，较强的语言文化敏感性、文学鉴赏能力和跨文化沟通能力；
- 3. 具备较强的运用现代信息技术获得信息、处理信息的能力，以及初步的创新研究、解决问题的能力；
- 4. 具备开阔的国际视野，较强的职业发展能力，能较快进入所从事的工作角色。

三、培养特色

本培养方案着重强调宽口径、厚基础的专业知识与人文素质的双重培养。为了适应国民经济和社会发展对外语人才需求的多元化趋势，开设英语语言文学、英汉互译与商务英语三个专业方向的选修课程，学生自主选择，实施英语专业人才的分类培养。

英语语言文学方向注重扎实的英语语言基础，比较系统的语言学 and 文学知识，较高的人文素养，较强的创新思维能力，为研究型人才培养奠定坚实的基础。

英汉互译方向注重培养英语语言基础扎实，人文素养较高，跨文化沟通能力较强，能胜任商务、旅游、法律等领域工作的应用型人才。

商务英语方向注重培养英语语言基础扎实，人文素养较高，国际视野开阔，国际商务实践能力较强，能胜任国际商务领域工作的应用型人才。

四、学制、毕业基本要求及学位授予

- 1. 本科基本学制 4 年，弹性学习年限 3—6 年，按照学分管理制度管理。
- 2. 英语专业学生毕业最低学分数为 165 学分，其中各类别课程及环节要求学分数如下表：

English

I . Objectives

This English program will enable students to develop a sound knowledge of English language skills and a broad knowledge of science and culture. Students are encouraged to develop a professional understanding of basic knowledge, theories and skills in linguistics, literature, translation, interpreting and business English. Graduates will be prepared for a wide range of career paths such as competent translators, interpreters, researchers, teachers and managers in foreign affairs, business, culture, press, education, research, tourism and other related fields.

II . Basic Specifications

The students are required to

1. gain a solid knowledge of English language and a strong capability of understanding and applying the language, as well as the ability of making comparative studies of English and Chinese; understand the differences between China and Western countries in aspects of culture, literature, philosophy and religion.
2. grasp systematically the professional knowledge of linguistics and literature, learn clearly about the society, history and culture of the main English-speaking countries, possess high humanistic quality, strong sensitivity of language and culture, as well as the capability of literature appreciation and intercultural communication.
3. acquire a strong ability of obtaining and processing information through the application of modern info-techniques, and a basic ability of innovative research and problem-solving.
4. have a broad international perspective, a strong ability of career development, and be well prepared for future careers.

III . Characteristics

The English program emphasizes particularly an all-round education that can build a solid foundation for students' English language proficiency and their humanistic spirit. In order to meet the diversified needs for foreign language experts in terms of the national economic and social development, the program is further specialized into three orientations — English language and literature, translation, and business English, each provided with different elective courses. Students are expected to choose these specialization courses of their own accord.

The English language and literature oriented program focuses on the preparation of students' academic research ability. To this end, the emphasis is laid on a solid foundation of English language proficiency, a systematic knowledge of linguistics and literature as well as the cultivation of innovative thinking.

The translation oriented program focuses on the cultivation of practical expertise with solid English skills, high humanistic quality and adequate competence in intercultural communication. Graduates shall be well prepared for a wide range of careers in such fields as business, tourism and law.

The business English oriented program focuses on the development of practical expertise with high English language proficiency, solid humanistic qualities, broad international vision and adequate international business practical skills. The graduates shall be well prepared for a wide range of careers related to international businesses.

IV. Length of Schooling, Basic Requirements for Graduation and Degree Conferment

1. The length of schooling for undergraduate studies is four years, with a flexible length lasting from 3 to 6 years, based on the regulation of credit system.
2. Students of English majors are expected to complete a minimum of 165 credits upon graduation, and the required credits for different courses are illustrated in the following table.
